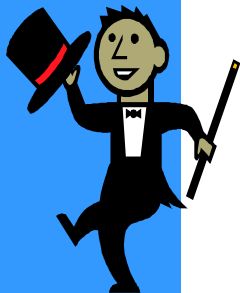


Our mission . . .

Did you ever wonder just what it takes to prepare for of a show???

Work begins by designers and directors weeks before auditions. Drawings are submitted, and budgets reviewed.

We have a six-week rehearsal schedule and a four-week build of sets and costumes.

Three weeks out we recruit Crews, the Box Office opens for reservations, and posters are printed.

Just six days away from Opening we put everything together—sets, lights, sound, costumes, wigs, and makeup—thousands of different tasks completed.

At every performance the Box Office is staffed, Ushers are in place, and Concession Workers at hand—all to bring you the best entertainment in town!

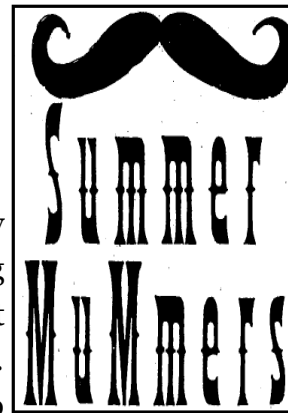

This is the backstage service wing of MCT and requires applicants to work 4 shows before becoming a member. Yearly dues of just \$5.00

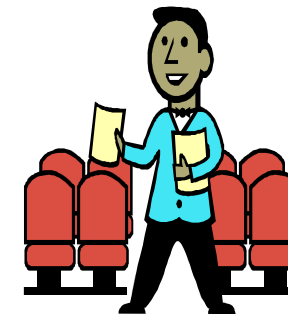
will guarantee admission into some really great parties! The HamHock Howl, The Hammy Awards, and Hogwash to name a few.
